Dear Members,

I hope that you are all having a healthy and enjoyable Summer. Our staff is working on our summer maintenance projects and most have been completed. Our current project is under way as we are sandblasting and painting the forklift wheel stops. As is the case with many of our maintenance projects the work is being done with in house employees. We are blessed to have some very talented individuals employed at the marina and they do a great job in keeping out facilities in top condition. Our club is 17 years old and continues to be a very impressive facility. Hats off to our management and employees.

As we are now at the peak time of hurricane season, we must keep very diligent regarding the weather. Our hurricane plan is posted on our website for your review. Depending on the severity of the weather it takes between 1 and 3 days to secure our facility. If lightening is within a 6-mile range of the club, we do not send our employees out to catch boats or assist in any way. Also, if the wind exceeds 20 mph we cannot launch or lift any boat out of the water. I ask all members to please respect these policies.

Our building capacity is at 97% which is a number that we have never achieved before in the summer. There is also a waiting list for many of the larger slips.

As reported in earlier reports, we now have 3 forklifts at our club. Our new forklift "Mama Bear" is working out beautifully.
